This is also the time you all as players need to have paid fees and brought in your chocolate money. This isn't something that someone from the club should have to chase you for.

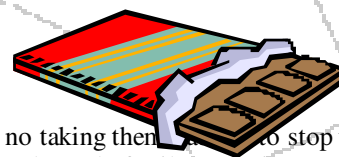
